But have you heard of the parasitic worm Levinseniella byrdi?


It turns small, shrimp-like creatures called amphipods

into ORANGE ZOMBIES.


These orange zombies wander carelessly out into the open where they are picked off by birds, the final host of the parasite.


Scientists have found that nutrient pollution - such as fertilizer runoff - leads to more zombie amphipods in a salt marsh.



This is troubling because nutrient pollution is common and could affect human health. While orange amphipods are harmless to humans, other parasite-carrying animals, like mosquitoes, are not.
